Dear Friends,

Some years ago Pope Francis dedicated the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time as the "Sunday of the Word of God" - this Sunday we reflect in a special way on the impact of Sacred Scripture on our lives.

Often people are confused at the difference between the Old Testament - the readings and psalms which Jesus himself read and which we hear He recounted in the synagogue in today's Gospel, and the New Testament which I like to separate between the 4 Gospel (like newspaper accounts of Jesus' words and actions) and the 23 books such as the Acts of the Apostles and the Letters of St Paul which interpret the words and actions of Jesus and the early Apostles.

The Old Testament foretold the coming of Jesus, the New Testament describes Him, His Words and Actions and then there is 'our testimony' how we live out and act out our Christian Values in our lives today. The Word of God is 'Alive and Active' through each of us - that is our duty as Christians, to live out in love the message that Jesus came to deliver. We are the hands and feet that are chosen to bring the message of hope to our homes and communities.

This year I would encourage you to decide to read a Gospel or a book from Scripture - but not just read it, rather to ask God to give you the wisdom and courage to be changed and challenged by it. Jesus' word always challenges us but this is why we have the Sacraments to nourish and strengthen our resolve that we may be faithful witnesses in His service.


