Dear Friends,

This Sunday's Gospel is a Gospel in which Jesus speaks to all the baptised encouraging us not to lose heart, not to be afraid and not to give up in our attempts at reaching out to others in His name. The readings remind us of the importance of being open to responding to God's call to service our response should always be "here I am, send me" St Paul reminds us that none of us are worthy of our calling as followers of Jesus but we are chosen by God's grace the fullness of God's plan for us will be known only in our eternal home.

The current Synod journey that the Church is engaged in is an opportunity for us to re-energise our sense of belonging in God's Church - this Jubilee Year dedicated to Hope is an opportunity for us as ambassadors of Jesus to be hope filled in all that we do, by radiating God's love to those we engage with and those whom we encounter.

I am often surprised by the language used by people when talking about the Church and / or faith, sometimes I hear people suggesting that they cannot "force" their children to go to Mass or that young people are "bored" by religion - we are reminded today in the readings that Faith is a 'Gift' - something precious and when we come to the sacraments particularly the Eucharist we are in the presence of Jesus - this is life changing if we recognise it for what it is, our language should therefore reflect how sacred these moments are for ourselves and those whom we speak to.


