Dear Friends,

"Let those without sin, cast the first stone" !! How often have we thrown stones and how often have we judged others and spoken unkind words? Like many of the Gospel passages used during Lent, today we are challenged - not that we must be saints but that we strive to live saintly lives. Of course our humanity can often get in the way of our desire to serve God in all our words and actions but our very relationship with God must truly enliven us to seek to grow in relationship with God such that we are witnesses to His love.

The world is a harsh place currently, war, violence, persecution, intolerance, and a discourse of darkness seem to fill our public square. Our children and young people are seeing and hearing all of this negativity and very seldom hear the language of love which is central to the Gospel message. We need our Churches to ring out the message of Easter and renew the hearts of those who languish under the weight of the material world, however sadly those who most need to hear the Good News of the Gospel are often the furthest away from it.

These next two week's can transform our lives, as we recognise our crosses and unite them with the Cross of Jesus - we are reminded that He walks with us always, even in our sinfulness and shame the Lord loves and protects us, just like He did the woman in the Gospel today. Jesus never seeks revenge, Jesus is the light of the World who is with us today as He was yesterday and will be until the end of time. Unlike the material world of change, Jesus is constant and faithful to all who follow

Let us together make a big effort to join in hope during these next few weeks and please do invite your family members to join also. The gift of faith is truly the greatest gift we can pass on.
